TREASURER'S REPORT

March was a rather busy month for the club's treasury. At the meeting, the club raised \$255 when 17 adults, including 4 new members, paid their annual dues. We sold all 10 books that members had ordered for \$184.71. The paid raffle raised \$67 and 9 T-shirts were sold for \$45. Please well

Club expenses are typically higher in January with \$608.27 for the Eastern Federation club liability insurance and \$304.50 for the Eastern Federation club dues. Other club expenses were routine, except for \$195 for the 11 books the club ordered (1 book for the club Library) and \$425.99 for specimens purchased at the Tuscon Show and the cost of their postage. The treasury balance is now about \$6,891.
