TREASURER'S REPORT






Club expenses for the month were routine, except for \$23.31 for lamination pouches and \$13.20 for postage.



MEMBER PROJECT

Jeff Sandmeier shared some photos of a project of his. He wrote the following: "I've been working on a project and just got finished. I started with a piece of opal I bought from the TOTE show several years ago. I decided I would try to make an opal doublet with it. I backed the opal with a piece of obsidian I had in my workshop. Then I used the disc cutter to cut 2 circles, and then to cut a smaller circle in one piece. I used a doming block and punches to make the two pieces rounded and domed."



















Additional Pipsico Boy Scout Reservation – Fossil Dig

Hosted by the Mountain October 24*, 25 and 26* 57 Pipsico Rd. Spring Grove, VA 23991

This additional dig happens rain or shine! The drive from the Tidewater area is about an hour and half. The actual dig is Wednesday, October 25 from 9:00 AM to Dusk. It is a very easy dig along the soft, sandy banks of the Jamestown River and is ideal for all ages and all skill sets. However, there is a short (1 quarter of a mile) walk to and from the parking area near the cabinettes to the waterfront and 1 mile from the mail parking lot. So, bring a cart to haul your tools, water, lunch and discoveries.

Once you check in at the waterfront shelter with Mr. Bill Stine, you can head down to the beach for surface collecting of whale & digging bones, shark teeth, echphora snail shells, driftwood, Chesapecten Jeffersonious Shells and much more. Don't forget to dress for the weather (I suggest layers), bring plenty of water & snacks and remember if you bring it in, please carry it out. All previous collecting rules still apply. Hand tools only. No climbing of steep river bank areas. No parking except in designated areas. No alcoholic beverages. Speed limit on camp road must be obeyed. If you want to make it a camping trip, contact Bill Stine by email at: rockdoctor48@wmconnect.com to rent a tent site or a dry cabinette. Campers may come in on Friday the 11th any time after noon. Tents may be set up in campsite 4 and there are latrine facilities and water at various locations. Showers may be available at the staff center. All overnight campers must exit the camp by noon on the 13th. Fees: \$10.00 (cash only) per person to collect or tent camp. Cabinette rental is \$25.00 – they are unheated, have no running water, support limited electrical usage and you will need to bring your own bedding. Do not bring electrical appliances as cooking is not allowed in the cabinettes. Parking for cabinettes only is in front of the dining hall.




A partial Echphora shell.

As you enter the boy scout reservation, follow the signs to Camp Lions. Pass to the right of the main building and veer to the left along the backside of the barn. You will pass several cottages on the left then go over a bridge and up a hill.

*Campers can arrive after noon on 10/24 and they have to be out of cabins by 10 am and off the property by noon on 10/26.
